Changes on the Board


At the February 10th Directors meeting, Director Mike Gajski stepped down as a director to become an alternate director. This moved Chuck Rozzo from his position as Alternate Director to Director status.

Financial Report to the Membership

To be more transparent, the Board of Directors is sharing the Fiscal Year 2025 Revenue and Expenses with the members. Our revenue for our past fiscal year (October 24-September 25) was \$50,679 and is broken down as shown below. We have excluded our EQT mineral rights payment as a one-time event and not a continuing revenue resource. Additionally, we have excluded our interest income on our investments as they are included with our investment account and not included in our yearly operating revenue.


Expenses for this period were \$55,647. We excluded our one-time income taxes paid on the EQT revenue. This revenue was not related to our mission as a not-for-profit organization so it was taxable. Our expenses are broken down as shown below.

In summary, our Club expenses have exceeded our revenue by \$4,968. While our investments will continue to earn income for the club and to be available for improvements to the club, they will not be used for annually operating expenditures.

To prevent future losses or needing to increase member dues, the Board is taking steps to increase revenue and decrease expenses. The Club is offering additional classes for members and guests and encouraging more fundraising participation. Members of the work parties spent several weeks finding and repairing a water line leak. This reduced our monthly water bill from \$271 in October to \$103 in November. We also renegotiated a three-year contract with the trash hauler that reduced the monthly charge from approximately \$225 to \$150. When the new storage building is finished, we will return the storage trailer and save approximately \$170 a month.

We will continue to look for cost savings and revenue opportunities. Additionally, we undertake an annual internal audit by our Members' Audit Committee to ensure that we are maintaining our financial practices and preventing any fiscal misuse. When you complete the process you can print out the clearance verification sheet yourself. You will have to bring that clearance sheet with you to the event and turn it in to the Club. When you send Steve Perry your e-mail about volunteering, he will send you the link to initiate the process, if you need to acquire your clearances.

If you can't come out and assist, but want to help the Scouts in this endeavor, please consider donating a box (50) or more of 22LR ammunition for the kids going for their rifle merit badge or a box (25) of 12ga or 20ga (preferred) shotgun shells (sizes #7-1/2, 8, or 9) for those attempting to earn their shotgun merit badge. That would be a kind and generous thing to do; for many years, no scout has ever had to pay additional fees for the extra .22LR ammunition required to earn their badge and we would like to extend that courtesy to those attempting to earn their shotgun merit badge as well, if we can.

Lebanon Sportsmen's Club) and qualified for the PIAA State Championships, scheduled for February 17-18 at the DuBois Rifle and Pistol Club.

Club Rifle Team

The Carrick Sportsmen's Pittsburgh and Suburban Rifle League team is looking for new shooters for and suggest you come out and give it a try!

The league shoots 3-position small-bore rifle. All matches are postal, i.e., each team shoots at their home range and the scores are tallied by a league scorekeeper. Adults and juniors shoot together on the same team with only the top 5 scores counting as the team score for the night. Currently, **they are shooting on Sunday evenings starting at 5:00 pm.** They use .22LR bolt-action rifles with non-magnifying scopes (red-dots) or open sights.

If you don't have a bolt-action rifle you can use one of the club's. The course of fire consists of 30 shots - 10 shots prone, 10 shots standing, and 10 shots kneeling, with no time limit.

There are about 8 teams participating from as far away as Akron and Erie. Matches have started and generally run through March with a couple of weeks break over the holidays in December. At the end of the year they have a banquet with an awards presentation.

Concealed Carry & Home Defense Course

When it comes to protecting your home and loved ones, being prepared is about more than just owning a firearm - it's about having a plan. Whether you are a brand-new gun owner or looking to sharpen your home defense strategy, the United States Concealed Carry Association (USCCA) Concealed Carry & Home Defense course is a must. Carrick Sportsmen's Club presented the course on Sunday, March 8 ; it was taught by USCCA-certified instructor, John Papinchak.

Over 1 million students nationwide have trusted the USCCA curriculum to gain the confidence and skills necessary to navigate critical incidents. This self-defense course is designed to take the "overwhelming" out of home security by providing a systematic approach to personal safety. Attendees learned how to avoid conflict entirely and, if the unthinkable happens, how to respond with legal and tactical precision. The course covered everything from the basics of handgun operation to the complexities of home defense law, including:

- **Developing a Personal and Home Protection Plan:** How to layer your security from the outside in - deterrence, barriers, and early warning systems. Including help to create a personalized Home Emergency Plan, including safe rooms, escape routes, and communication strategies.
- **Self-Defense Firearms Basics:** Universal Safety rules, caliber choices, and defensive firearm choices.
- **Defensive Shooting Fundamentals:** Defensive shooting vs. marksmanship, stance, unsighted fire, and trigger control.
- **The Legal Use of Force:** The details on the Castle Doctrine, Stand Your Ground laws, and the "Use of Force" continuum in defending yourself and your property.

Attendees received a copy of Michael Martin's "Concealed Carry and Home Defense Fundamentals" (a \$25 value).

This expansive guide serves as the official textbook for the course, covering shooting fundamentals, gear selection, and situational awareness in detail. The cost was \$25 for members; \$40 for guests.

Basic Handgun Class

Whether you just purchased your first firearm, are considering purchasing, or simply want to sharpen your foundational skills, the right training makes all the difference.

Carrick Sportsmen's Club is sponsoring a United States Concealed Carry Association (USCCA) Basic Handgun course which will be taught by USCCA-certified instructor, John Papinchak. This comprehensive, four-hour course is designed to turn your interest into a lifelong passion by building the confidence, mindset, and skills necessary for safe and successful shooting. The course will take place on Sunday, March 22 at 1:00 p.m. and will last about 4 hours. All proceeds benefit Carrick Sportsmen's Club

Note: If you cannot make this session, we plan to repeat this course in May and September.

The Allegheny County Sheriff's Office is offering the opportunity to easily obtain or renew your concealed carry permit at satellite locations throughout the County through the end of the year. Please be mindful of your permit expiration date. They are valid for five years but that time can expire and you might not be aware of it. Please check your permit expiration date. If yours is close to expiring, you can visit one of the following locations at the dates listed:

- **Saturday, April 11 - Monroeville**, 2700 Monroeville Boulevard from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- **Saturday, May 16 - Jefferson Hills**, 925 Old Clairton Road from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- **Saturday, June 6 - North Fayette**, 580 Donaldson Road from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- **Saturday, July 11 - Glassport**, 12 Monongahela Avenue from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- **Saturday, October 24 - Elizabeth Township**, 6001 Smithfield Street, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- **Saturday, November 21 - South Park**, 2575 Brownsville Road.

Handgun Cleaning Class

Carrick Sportsmen's Club hosted a free handgun cleaning class for members on Tuesday, March 10 at 7:00 p.m. as an opportunity for members to learn and practice maintenance and care for your firearms. It was a hands-on class and covered

- Handgun disassembly and assembly
- Proper inspection
- Cleaning, lubrication, and storage

Attendees were to bring their handguns (no ammunition), any specialized tools for disassembly (wrenches, screwdrivers, etc.) and their owner's manual (if they had it). They also needed a cleaning mat or old towel and cleaning supplies (cloths, fluids, brushes, etc.). The Club had supplies on hand if participants don't have them. This was a great way to learn the proper ways to clean your firearms in a friendly, social environment where you can have your questions answered. The class was free to members and \$10 for guests. The next gun cleaning classes are scheduled for Tuesday, July 14 and Tuesday, November 3.

Open Trap Shooting

When they resume shooting, Trap Shooting will be held on Sundays from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm and Wednesdays from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm. These shoots are open to all members and their guests.

They are now shooting metal silhouettes on the indoor range and will go to the outdoor pistol range for bowling pins shoots through the summer.

If you would like to try the silhouette shoots, you can just come to the club at about 6:45 pm on Monday and sign up. They shoot at three different silhouettes - pigs, chickens and groundhogs. The shoot 10 shots on each set of targets for a total of 30 shots. The winner is the shooter

who hits the most targets. The cost for this shoot is \$2.00 per shooter and the winner gets his money back. This is a fun evening and matches often end in a tie and move on to a tie-breaker - a 2-inch square silhouette

Metro Police Revolver League (MPRL)

The MPRL team competes against teams from other clubs in the area, with each team shooting at their home club; scores are submitted to, and tallied by, the league scorekeeper (Jan Joos).

They shoot both .22 and center fire matches, and you can shoot either or both courses of fire. Each match - .22 and center-fire - shoots 3 courses of fire: Slow Fire -10 rounds in 10 minutes, Timed Fire - two 5-shot strings at 20 seconds each, and Rapid Fire - two 5-shot strings at 10 seconds each - **All One-Handed! You can shoot either or both courses of fire.**

The team is currently shooting on the indoor range on Thursdays at 7:00 p.m. and is in fourth place out of seven teams in .22 and fourth out of 6 teams in center fire.

The team needs new shooters. They have enough shooters to maintain the Club team as an independent team in the league but they are always looking for new members. They are urging anyone who is interested to come out and shoot with the team. You'll get a feel for the shooting regime and meet the members of the team. You can shoot with the team but your scores will not count until you actually join the team. Please consider joining the MPRL team.

If you would you like to try a different type of shooting or want to test your muscle memory and reflexes, consider trying this league! If you want to take on the challenge of shooting with one hand, then come on out any Thursday evening at 6:00 pm to the indoor range and give it a try!

If you decide to join, there is a minimal fee to join the league
